Barriers

Inverness Primary School provides full opportunities for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

The Parent and Family Engagement Plan is posted on the school website. In addition, the plan will be emailed to all families at the beginning of the school year, and can be requested from the main office at any time.

We encourage the participation of parents and family members in regular, two-way, meaningful communication involving academic learning and other school activities.
